Note Summary:

The meeting began with Zoe Fry welcoming participants and establishing that the session would be recorded for transparency. Laura Shallcross and Mike Slator discussed the collaboration on summarizing care home visits. Sonia was prompted to share any action points from previous meetings. The primary goal of the session was to promote open communication and tackle ongoing tasks related to the project.

Laura provided an update on the project's progress, indicating that they are approaching a critical phase of data flow, with an important meeting scheduled for November. She highlighted governance challenges and technical considerations regarding data hosting, aiming for a January start. Mike reported increased interest in training as data collection nears, with around 600 care homes engaged.

The discussion then shifted to the dashboards project, which aims to present relevant data for care providers and residents, focusing on metrics such as hospital admissions and infection rates. Stakeholders, including Deji Oyelade from UKHSA, emphasized the need for comprehensive data analysis and the importance of incorporating quality of life measures in future iterations.

The meeting also addressed the responsibilities of the Adult Social Care Engagement Collective, with a focus on including individuals with lived experiences in shaping the group's membership. Concerns about governance and potential conflicts of interest were raised, particularly regarding participant roles in data collection. The discussion highlighted the importance of engaging residents and their families, with suggestions for drop-in sessions to facilitate their input.

The meeting concluded with reflections on a successful care home visit in Telford, emphasizing the significance of influential figures in the research process and the positive reception of the project at the Birmingham Care Show. The next meeting date will be in February 2025.
