Summary

Vivaldi Social Care Data Pipeline Progress: Oliver, supported by Mike and Zoe, provided a comprehensive update on the progress of the Vivaldi social care data pipeline, detailing the number



of participating care homes, the activation process, and the types of data being collected and analysed, with input from stakeholders such as NHS England and digital care record suppliers.

Oliver presented the first report that shared the latest findings. The report was designed to be a snapshot of where things stand right now.

Development and Rollout of Data Dashboard: Oliver and Victoria Hall discussed the upcoming UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) data dashboard, which will provide participating care homes with access to their own healthcare data summaries, with the dashboard expected to be available in the next two to three months following finalisation of data sharing agreements.

Stakeholder Engagement and Communication Strategies: Rob, Victoria Longstaff, Lianne, and others discussed strategies for effectively communicating project findings to care home staff, residents, and stakeholders, including the use of mini recordings, visual aids, and virtual events to enhance understanding and engagement.

Upcoming Events and Next Steps: Zoe outlined plans for upcoming events, including a parliamentary reception and a proposed virtual stakeholder meeting in December, with input from Kate, Francesco, and Rob on event structure, report distribution, and potential ministerial engagement

Q: By December, will there be a few more months of data from existing homes — enough to show a cumulative picture, for example as winter approaches?

A:

We'll have the mid-November extract by then, but there's a lag in hospital admissions and prescriptions data. So we'll have information up to around September. Real-time updates are a future goal, but for now, it'll be a growing dataset.
